2. Hazards Identification

Emergency overview Aerosol. CONTENTS UNDER PRESSURE. Harmful in contact with eyes.

Eyes Contact may irritate or burn eyes. Eye contact may result in corneal injury.

4. First Aid Measures

First aid procedures
Eye contact Immediately flush eyes with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes. Remove contact lenses, if present and easy to do. Continue rinsing. Get medical attention immediately.
Skin contact Immediately take off all contaminated clothing. Wash off with warm water and soap. Get medical attention if irritation develops or persists.
Inhalation If symptoms develop move victim to fresh air. If symptoms persist, get medical attention.
Ingestion In the unlikely event of swallowing contact a physician or poison control center. Have victim rinse mouth thoroughly with water. Never give anything by mouth to a victim who is unconscious or is having convulsions. Do not induce vomiting without advice from poison control center.

Suitable extinguishing media	Water fog. Foam. Dry chemical powder. Carbon dioxide (CO2).

Protective equipment and precautions for firefighters	In the event of fire and/or explosion do not breathe fumes. Wear full protective clothing, including helmet, self-contained positive pressure or pressure demand breathing apparatus, protective clothing and face mask. Containers should be cooled with water to prevent vapor pressure build up.

6. Accidental Release Measures

Methods for containment	Eliminate all ignition sources (no smoking, flares, sparks, or flames in immediate area). Stop leak if you can do so without risk. Move the cylinder to a safe and open area if the leak is irreparable. Stop the flow of material, if this is without risk. Prevent entry into waterways, sewers, basements or confined areas.
Methods for cleaning up	Should not be released into the environment. Use a non-combustible material like vermiculite, sand or earth to soak up the product and place into a container for later disposal. Small Spills: Wipe up with absorbent material (e.g. cloth, fleece). Clean contaminated surface thoroughly.

Handling	Pressurized container: Do not pierce or burn, even after use. Do not handle or store near an open flame, heat or other sources of ignition. Do not smoke while using or until sprayed surface is thoroughly dry. Do not use if spray button is missing or defective. Use only with adequate ventilation. Do not get this material in contact with eyes. Do not get this material in contact with skin. Avoid prolonged exposure.
Storage	Level 1 Aerosol. Contents under pressure. Do not puncture, incinerate or crush. Keep away from heat, sparks, and flame. Avoid exposure to long periods of sunlight. Store in cool place. Keep the container dry. Keep out of the reach of children. Level 1 Aerosol (NFPA 30B) Do not store, incinerate, or heat this material above 120 degrees Fahrenheit.
